

Now the EPA is pushing to make all U.S. waters under their control and then DEQ will come back with limitations put on the miners because even those little dry tributaries could be considered ESH. And apparently the DEQ has finalized their listing of 303-D streams. Tom said he heard they added 1200 more streams. Mike H. also noted that the U.N. 2111 small arms treaty that is trying to do away with our second amendment rights was rejected by the senate by a 56 to 43 vote.
